#### **Institutional and Program Summary:**

Summary of Activities: Teach one course per semester in our new Global Studies Fellows Program (GSFP), work with GSFP student(s) on a research project, and collaborate with a DePauw mentor (a tenure-track faculty member) to organize:

- 1) an interdisciplinary global learning faculty and staff reading group (fall)
- 2) a global learning pedagogy workshop (spring)
- 3) an end-of-year presentation of GSFP student-faculty research projects (spring).

Give public talks at Putnam County Library and Wabash College.

Academic Program: The S-I-R will be housed in the GSFP (as a non-voting member of its steering committee) and the academic department that best aligns with the S-I-R's research and teaching. The S-I-R will teach one course per semester: an "Introduction to Global Studies" course and an upper-division GSFP course in the S-I-R's area of academic expertise. The former is a new course, and the S-I-R will participate in its development by creating a teaching module for it. The S-I-R will also help shape the program by co-organizing a global learning pedagogy workshop (open to all Great Lakes College Association schools) and a global learning reading group for DePauw faculty and staff members. They will also mentor students through a student-faculty research project, by co-organizing a presentation of GSFP student-faculty research, and by working with leaders of student groups to support DePauw's internationalization efforts (e.g., International Education Week events).

Scholar Profile: The S-I-R's qualifications should include a PhD in a humanities or social science discipline, an active research project on a global topic, and at least two years teaching experience at the undergraduate level. Service experience with a Global Studies program and a knowledge of and commitment to a liberal arts education would be welcome. Courses at DePauw would be taught in English.

Plans for Other Campus Activities: Student engagement will include student-faculty research; co-organizing with a DePauw faculty member an end-of-year presentation of GSFP student-faculty research; participating in International Education Week events as a speaker; interviews with campus radio, newspaper, and institutional communication outlets; as well as opportunities to work with DePauw's International Student Association.

By co-organizing a global learning reading group and the pedagogy workshop, the scholar will meet a variety of faculty and staff members. As a non-voting member of the GSFP Steering Committee, the scholar will also meet a cadre of

DePauw faculty members with shared research and teaching interests in global learning. Since the GSFP will be affiliated with the Center for Diversity and Inclusion and the Prindle Institute for Ethics, the scholar will also interact with administrators, faculty, and students who are part of these programs. The scholar will also be invited to all DePauw faculty events.

Community Outreach: The S-I-R has been invited to give two public talks in our local community. The Putnam County Public Library in Greencastle, Indiana, will arrange for a talk on a global topic related to the S-I-R's academic expertise in the fall of 2023. Wabash College, located a 30-minute drive away in Crawfordsville, Indiana, has also invited the S-I-R to give a public lecture and to meet with Wabash faculty members and students for a reception or dinner to help facilitate connections. In addition, The Hamilton Lugar School of International and Global Studies at Indiana University, Bloomington (an hour south of DePauw) has also agreed to include the S-I-R in announcements about International Studies events (e.g., lectures, workshops, etc.) during the 2023-2024 academic year, which will also enable connections with our local community.
